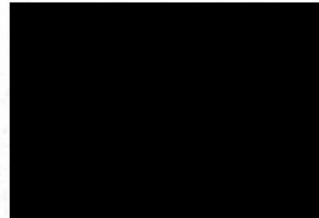

Current Balance Owed: \$21,241.96

This letter is to confirm the informal payment plan regarding the assessments relating to the above-referenced accounts. It does not apply to any other assessments owed to the State of Ohio other than the assessments currently assigned to our office as of the date of this letter. As you know, the **Ohio Department of Taxation** has the right to file post-judgment collection proceedings against you and your assets to satisfy the delinquent assessments noted above. This letter will confirm the agreement not to do so at this time, provided that you do the following:

1. Make the payments described below; and
2. Stay current on **Ohio Department of Taxation** liabilities as they become due; and
3. Agree that the State of Ohio may commence an initial action to collect these taxes at any time in the future in the event you breach this payment agreement.

Failure to agree may result in the filing of post-judgment collection proceedings against you or your assets. A signed copy of this letter must be returned to our office within seven days to prevent these proceedings.

This agreement prevents future civil proceedings against you during its term. You agree that any civil proceedings initiated by the State of Ohio prior to the execution of this agreement may proceed and, if successful, may be applied against the above-referenced balance due. This payment plan does not affect any jurisdiction's right to take criminal action against you for the nonpayment of tax, nor does it prevent the filing of liens or income tax refunds or lottery award offsets.

You have agreed to make an initial payment of **\$7,500** on **November 14, 2024**, subsequently you agree to make **monthly** payments of **\$1,400.00** due on the _____ of every month starting on **December** ____, 2024 toward the payoff amount set forth above until paid in full. The balance will change as interest continues to accrue. If your scheduled payment falls on a weekend or holiday, then your payment may be processed the following business day. There will be no grace period given for receipt of payment.
