PAYMENT PLAN AGREEMENT

Period(s):

Individual Income Tax: 12/31/2013

Amount Due: \$9,264.53

Why you are getting this letter:

- We agree to stop action to collect your tax debt, if monthly payments of \$345.00 are received in this office every 30 days, beginning July 14, 2025.

What you need to do:

- Submit your initial payment of \$345.00 within 30 days from the date of this letter.
- Create a new account or sign in to My Alabama Taxes (MAT) for all payments.
 - View your account and make payments at <https://myalabamataxes.alabama.gov>
 - Call 1-800-322-4106 for assistance with creating/viewing your account on MAT.
 - If you do not have access to a computer with internet to log into your MAT account, submit your payment with the vouchers provided.
 - You must write your account number, social security number, or Letter ID number on your payments.

What will happen if you do nothing:

- Any default of this plan, **or failure to file and pay any future taxes to the Alabama Department of Revenue**, will result in immediate collection action without additional notice.
- Such collection action(s) will include issuing a Writ of Garnishment or Execution to your County Sheriff.

Payment Options

Bankruptcy

If you are in bankruptcy, federal law automatically stops most actions against you or you property. You may be considered in bankruptcy if:

Either:

1. You have not received a discharge, and
2. Your case has not been dismissed or closed, and
3. The specific tax period is prior to filing bankruptcy

Or:

1. The indicated liability has been discharged by the Bankruptcy Court.

If you believe collection of this liability is barred by the bankruptcy, or by a discharge you receive, contact Collection Services Division at the address below within 30 days. We will verify your information and determine whether to stop collection procedures.

- Tax account number(s)
- Bankruptcy case number and chapter
- Specific Court district in which the case is filed
